• God is **passionate** about **setting** you **free**.

Isaiah 61:1-3 (NASB)

the LORD has anointed me.....To proclaim liberty to captives and

Luke 4:14-21 (NASB)

- ¹⁵ And Jesus *began* teaching in their synagogues and was praised by all.
- ¹⁶ And Jesus came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up; and as was His custom, Jesus entered the synagogue on the Sabbath, and stood up to read.
- ¹⁷ And the book of the prophet Isaiah was handed to Him. And He opened the book and found the place where it was written, ¹⁸ "THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD IS UPON ME, BECAUSE HE ANOINTED ME TO PREACH THE GOSPEL TO THE POOR. 2. God wants to set you free from the **power** of **sin**.

Romans 7:14-17

- ¹⁵ I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do.
- ¹⁶ And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good.
- ¹⁷ As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me.

3. God wants to set you free from the slavery of sin.

Genesis 4:7 (NASB)

sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it."

John 15:4-11 (NASB)

he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing.

4. God wants to set you free from the **stain** (defilement) of **sin**.

Ezekiel 23:37-38

³⁷ "For they have committed adultery, and blood is on their hands.....they have done this to Me: they have defiled My sanctuary.

2 Chronicles 36:14

¹⁴ Furthermore, all the officials of the priests and the people were very unfaithful *following* all the abominations of the nations; and they defiled the house of the LORD.

Lamentations 4:13-14

¹³ Because of the sins of her prophets *And* the iniquities of her priests, Who have shed in her midst The blood of the righteous; ¹⁴ They wandered, blind, in the streets; They (the righteous) were defiled with blood.

Genesis 34:1-5

- ¹ Now Dinah the daughter of Leah, whom she had borne to Jacob, went out to visit the daughters of the land.
- ² When Shechem the son of Hamor the Hivite, the prince of the land, saw her, he took her and lay with her by force.....
- ⁵ Now Jacob heard that he had defiled Dinah his daughter.
- 5. Christ came to earth, <u>lived</u> a perfect life, <u>died</u> on the cross, and <u>rose again</u> for the <u>purpose</u> of removing sins we have committed and sins that have been committed against us.

Hebrews 9:13-14 (NASB)

¹³ For if the blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer sprinkling those who have been defiled sanctify for the cleansing of the flesh,

¹⁴ how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, cleanse your conscience

Ezekiel 36:25-26 (NASB)

²⁵ "Then I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your filthiness...... ²⁶ "Moreover, I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; and I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh.

6. To start the **process** of being set free from the **stain** of **sin** you must **confess** the **sin** to God and others.

1 John 1:9 (NASB)

⁹ If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

James 5:16 (NASB)

¹⁶ Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another so that you may be healed. The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much.

- 7. To **complete** the **process** of being set free from the stain of sin you must **forgive**.
- 8. When sin is done <u>against</u> you a <u>deadly</u> attachment has been made with you and the one who <u>offended</u> you.
- 9. This <u>deadly</u> attachment can <u>produce</u> anger, <u>fear</u>, excessiveness, dependency, compulsion, and <u>low</u> self-worth.
- 10. <u>Forgiveness</u> is <u>not</u> letting the person <u>off</u> the hook. <u>Forgiveness</u> is pulling the hook from your mouth and <u>giving</u> it to God.

Deuteronomy 32:35 (NASB)

³⁵ 'Vengeance is Mine, and retribution, In due time their foot will slip; For the day of their calamity is near, And the impending things are hastening upon them.'

Romans 12:19 (NASB)

¹⁹ Never take your own revenge, beloved, but leave room for the wrath *of God,* for it is written, "VENGEANCE IS MINE, I WILL REPAY," says the Lord.

1 Peter 2:23 (NASB)

²³ and while being reviled, Jesus did not revile in return; while suffering, Jesus uttered no threats, but kept entrusting *Himself* to God who judges righteously;

11. <u>Forgiveness</u> is the powerful statement, "I will not be <u>owned</u> by a sin nor a <u>victimizer</u>, but by a God who set me <u>free</u> from both."

Proverbs 19:11 (NIV)

it is to a man's glory to overlook an offense.

Isaiah 43:18-19 (NIV)

¹⁸ "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past.

¹⁹ See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland.

How do I forgive?

• <u>Believe</u> that it is <u>possible</u> to get off the <u>hook</u> of a sin that has been done <u>against</u> you.

Matthew 19:26 (NIV)

...with God all things are possible."

• Make a <u>list</u> of the <u>offenses</u> done against you.

Psalm 32:5 (NASB)

⁵ I acknowledged my sin to You, And my iniquity I did not hide; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD"; And You forgave the guilt of my sin.

• Make a <u>list</u> of the <u>pain</u> that it has caused you.

Psalm 56:8 (NASB)

⁸ You have taken account of my wanderings; Put my tears in Your bottle. Are *they* not in Your book?

 Ask yourself: Do I want to <u>carry</u> the <u>pain</u> for the rest of my <u>life</u>?

Acts 8:23 (NASB)

²³ "For I see that you are full of bitterness and captive to sin."

Job 5:2 (NASB)

² "For anger slays a man,

 Pull the sinful <u>hook</u> from your mouth and <u>give</u> it to God by saying, "You do not <u>own</u> me anymore."

1 Corinthians 6:19-20 (NASB)

¹⁹ Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, ²⁰ For you have been bought with a price

1 Peter 2:24 (NASB)

²⁴ He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed.

John 10:10 (NASB)

¹⁰ "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have *it* abundantly.

• Embark on a <u>ministry</u> to help those who have been <u>stained</u> with the same <u>sin</u>.

Galatians 6:1-2 (NIV)

- ¹Brothers, if someone is caught in a sin, you who are spiritual should restore him....
- ² Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.
- Remember the concept: the only <u>people</u> who get to see God at His <u>best</u> are the ones who have seen Satan at his <u>worst</u>.
- 12. Freedom in Christ is viewing your life from the

perspective of His <u>cross</u>. For it is there we get our <u>value</u>, our identity, and our <u>life</u>.
